

Giving Through Your Donor-Advised Fund

What is a Donor-Advised Fund?

A **Donor-Advised Fund (DAF)** is a charitable giving account that allows you to support the causes you care about in a flexible and tax-efficient way. **Make a contribution to your DAF, receive an immediate tax deduction, then, recommend grants to your favorite nonprofits over time.** DAFs are typically managed by community foundations or financial institutions, such as Fidelity Charitable, Schwab Charitable, Vanguard Charitable, and others.

Advantages of Giving From Your Donor-Advised Fund:

1. **Tax Benefits:** Donating from your DAF often allows for more strategic tax advantages. This means that every dollar you give to the Poe Center can stretch even further.
2. **Simplified Giving:** Managing your charitable giving through a DAF can streamline your philanthropy. It allows you to plan your donations over time and supports a more impactful approach to your charitable goals.
3. **Legacy of Giving:** Utilizing your DAF creates an opportunity for you to establish a lasting legacy.

How do DAF Grants Support the Poe Center?

When you recommend a grant from your DAF, your sponsoring organization sends funds directly to the Poe Center. These grants:

- Provide critical, reliable funding for our programs and initiatives.
- Allow us to plan for long-term impact and sustainability.
- Reduce administrative burden and processing fees

How to Give Through Your DAF:

1. Log in to your DAF account.
2. Search for and recommend a grant to the nonprofit:
 - a. Legal Name: Alice Aycock Poe Center for Health Education
 - b. Tax ID (EIN): 56-1500678
 - c. Mailing Address: 224 Sunnybrook Rd, Raleigh, NC 27610
3. Submit your recommendation, and your DAF sponsor will send the grant directly to Poe Center.
